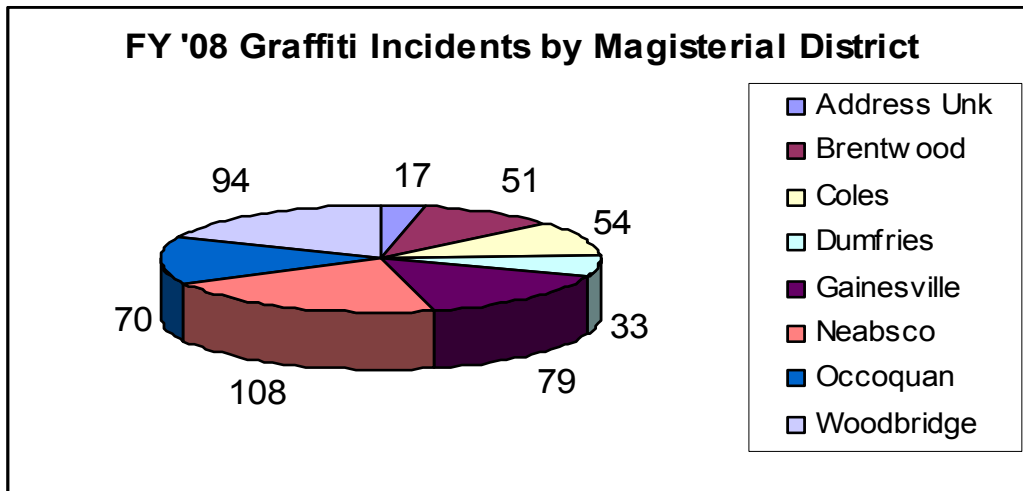


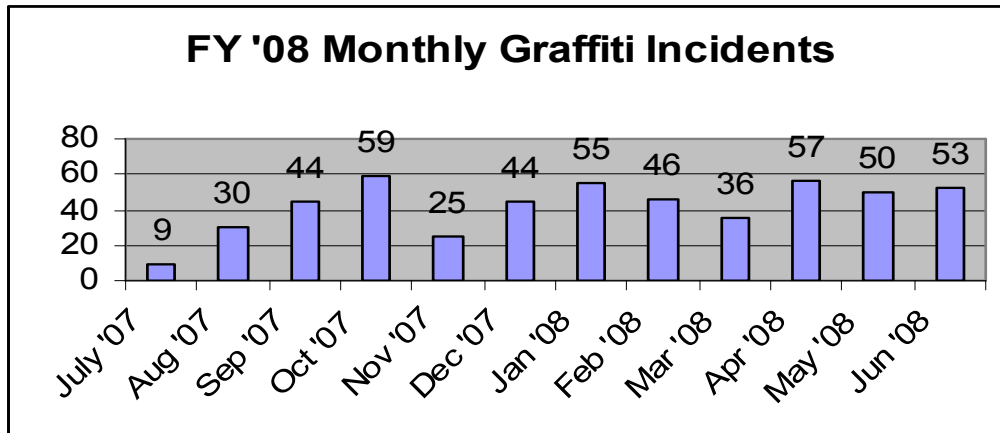
Prince William Clean Community Council
Graffiti Incident Summary
FY 2008

There have been a total of 508 graffiti incidents reported to the Prince William Clean Community Council for the fiscal year 2008. (These numbers are based on reports received through June 20, 2008) The incidents are reported to the Council by the PWC Police Department, PWC Graffiti Spotters and concerned citizens. The reported cases closed/removed are 312 although there may be more cases closed, they have not been reported to the Council as of June 20.

The chart below provides the number of incidents per PWC Magisterial District. The “Address Unk” category is based on incidents reported without an address and therefore the Council was unable to identify the appropriate Districts. Although some districts have more incidents than others, all of the Magisterial Districts’ communities have been tainted by graffiti vandalism.

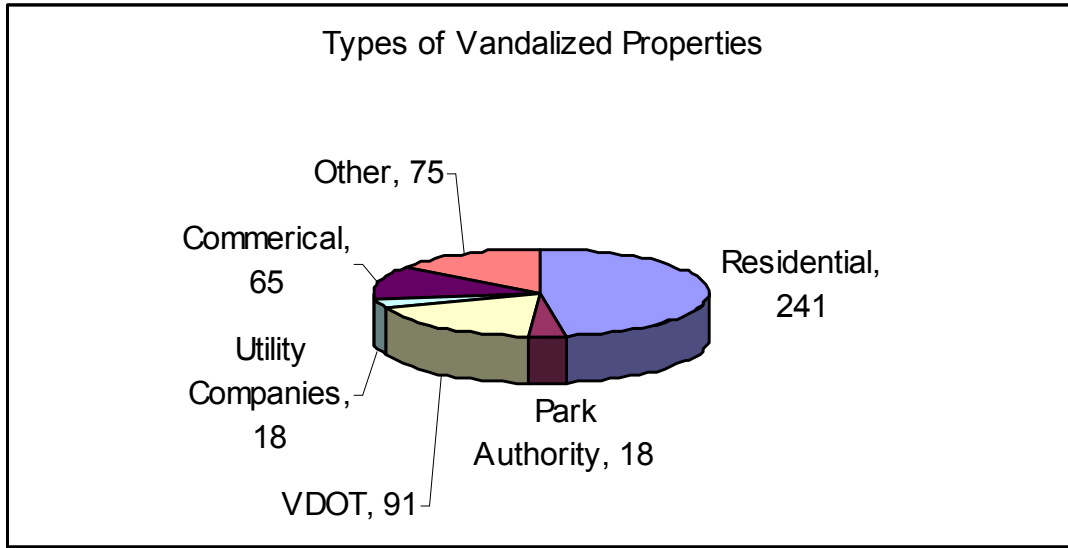


The chart below shows the number of incidents for each month. These figures are through June 20, 2008 therefore there is an expected increase in the number of incidents for the remainder of June.



This chart denotes the seven major types of properties vandalized with graffiti and ultimately who is responsible for removal. The “other” category includes vehicles and agencies with less than five reported incidents.

The Council notifies the property owners and/or responsible agencies regarding the graffiti and requests immediate removal. In the case of residential properties, the Council offers a free bottle of graffiti remover. If vandalized more than three times, a \$25 reward is given to the property owner if removed within 72 hours. This is an added incentive for immediate removal.



The chart below reflects gang related versus non-gang related graffiti. It is important to note that the majority of graffiti incidents are non-gang (415) to 93 (gang).
